

# Let's make sure that our Quizlet sets are correct :

1. Are you choosing good words? [not too difficult, not too easy]
2. Do you have only English words in the boxes on the left?
3. When you have a definition in a box on the right, do you have the **part of speech** in parentheses?
4. When you have an example sentence in a text box on the right, do you have a **blank space**?
5. Can you find any vocabulary words in the text boxes on the right? [this is bad]  
[ A vocabulary word cannot be used in the definition or example sentence for it ]
6. Can you find any **spelling mistakes**? [this is bad]  
[Often, example sentences need a different spelling for the word; you may need to add an -s or -ed, etc]
7. When you have synonyms in a text box on the right, do you have this? → **(synonyms)**
8. When you have antonyms in a text box on the right, do you have this? → **(antonyms)**
9. Do you have some **images** on the right? [but not too many]
